MAKING AN IMPACT

The YRC served **254 youth**, offered more than **86 hours** of therapeutic support groups including pet therapy, a Process Support Group held every Monday (The Huddle) and Tuesday (Level Up) along with the YWCA's Power of Sisterhood group every Thursday. Through our partnership with Alluvion Health and Juvenile Probation, **12 youth** completed Anger Management group. The results are hopeful after a yearlong effort to engage youth in our community, we successfully assisted:

- 327 hours of community service were completed.
- 3 youth were placed in emergency housing.
- 18 youth received employment support.
- 3 youth were referred to and completed HiSET classes.

Through our Great Falls Public Schools disengaged youth outreach, we contacted **48 at- risk youth** and had astonishing results: **82%** improved their attendance, **7** completed transformational learning receiving high school credit, and **11** graduated.

1ST ANNUAL BACK2SCHOOL BLAST

This was a community-wide event with multiple partner agencies including the Great Falls Rescue Mission, United Way of Cascade County, and Alluvion Health that wouldn't have been possible without the generous sponsorships of so many organizations, especially the Town Pump Charitable Foundation.

Back2School Blast was a one-stop shop for at-risk youth and families that were in need and every child that participated received what they needed to start the school year strong. Thanks to all our volunteers, staff members, and community partners B2SB was a huge success:

Our Christmas Outreach partnership with "Bikers for Kids in Need" helped 75 families in the community which included providing over 236 youth with a complete Christmas meal and age-appropriate gifts, hygiene items, and school supplies.






What's Trending? Legislative Alerts & Calls to Action (2,200+ subscribers)



Protected the Clean Indoor Air Act from numerous attempts by local legislator to dismantle it.



Defeated attempt to defund the Montana Tobacco Use Prevention Program.



Crushed the effort to segregate e-cigarettes & vapes from traditional tobacco products in industry's attempt to restrict regulations on ENDS (electronic nicotine delivery systems).



Halted the many attempts by local legislators to weaken Montana's already anemic DUI Laws.



Worked to close the loophole in the Farm Bill to prevent delta-8 products from popping up behind counters at gas stations, convenience stores & vape shops AND supported efforts to restrict the sale of Kratom to youth.

ADVOCACY IN ACTION



Advocated to keep marijuana dispensaries restricted to industrial areas only with in the Great Falls city limits.



Supported the City of Great Falls adding marijuana to the existing social host ordinance.

EMOTIONAL HEALTH

#LETSTALK APP

The Alliance for Youth #LetsTalk app is designed to provide youth with useful and relatable information about mental health and suicide prevention... all at their fingertips. Whether the user be the person at risk or a friend or family member, through this custom app we can make sure the information they receive is accurate, relevant and trustworthy. It also provides additional resources such as safe spaces for those who might be in a vulnerable state. There were more than 600 new downloads in 2023, however the site had to be entirely rebuilt, due to app hosting rights.



QPR a suicide prevention training for participants to be able to recognize the warning signs of suicide and question, persuade, and refer people at risk for suicide for help. In 2023, we facilitated **seven (7) trainings** with 130 participants overall.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

YMHFA is a public education program which introduces participants to the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention, and teaches individuals how to help an adolescent in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. In 2023, we facilitated **one (1)** training with nine (9) youth probation and parole officers.









PEER MENTORING GROUPS

We partnered with the Great Falls Public School
District and United Way of Cascade County to
develop, facilitate and grow their Peer Mentoring
Program. In 2023, there were **five** (5) school groups
(CMR High School, Great Falls High School, Paris
Gibson Education Center & East Middle School) with
a total of **82 youth** participating.

Students volunteered with the desire to do peer-to-peer mentoring. They were trained in evidence-based mental health practices and how to identify peers who are struggling with anxiety, depression, trauma or grief. They are then able to refer peers to the appropriate resources.

All groups are facilitated by a GFPS Mental Health Therapist with support from School Counselors. Students meet weekly during designated class periods for 50 minutes.

- Family-centered, designed to build nurturing parenting skills as an alternative to abusive & neglectful parenting practices.

Families Completed Thanks to the support of the Montana Children's Trust Fund, United Way of Cascade County, and City of Great Falls, our parenting programs had a significant impact on youth and families in our community:





















- More than 90% of parents demonstrated an improved knowledge in one or more risk factors (expectation of child, parental empathy, use of corporal punishment, parent-child family roles and child's power and independence.
- Out of 15 parents who successfully completed Nurturing Parenting, 8 were able to be contacted for a 6-month follow-up and 100% of those had not engaged in abusive or neglectful behavior or recidivated in any partner/family assault.


